**Format:** Three games on a pair of lanes. One adult & one youth will constitute a team.

**Awards:** All prize funds will be returned as YOUTH scholarships. There is NO PRIZE for the adult member of the teams. All prize funds will be deposited in an account for youth scholarships. Youth winners in this event will receive POINTS that will be used to determine the amount of scholarship funding they will be eligible to receive if they meet the academic requirements. See Rule 11.

The Bay Area USBC Association will contribute \$20 per team to the scholarship fund up to a maximum of \$500. Jeff's Pro Shop (Jeff Storrs) has donated \$250 to the Scholarship Fund.

## Rules and Regulations: Adult / Youth Scholarship Tournament

1. YOUTH bowlers must be a member of the Bay Area USBC Association as of November 1, 2011 to be eligible to participate. ADULT bowlers must be USBC certified members from ANY association. Adult bowlers who are not members of the Bay Area USBC Association or ANY OTHER association may purchase a affiliate membership card for \$17.00.
2. The tournament will be conducted on ONE DAY ONLY– 4 bowlers to a lane will be scheduled. Maximum entry will be 160 teams.
3. The tournament will be conducted on a handicap basis of 100% from 440.
4. There will be only ONE division – no age groups or gender separation.
5. There will be NO PRIZES for the adult team member. Scholarship qualification points for the YOUTH bowlers will be awarded on a 1 for every 8 entry basis. All scholarship funds will be administered through the Bay Area USBC Association Scholarship Fund.
6. The highest USBC average in ANY association for the 2010-11 season will be used. Summer league averages will be used ONLY if no winter averages available. If bowler has no average for the 2010-11 season, they will use current average at the time of bowling but must have completed a minimum of 7 leagues sessions (14 game minimum for youth bowlers and 21 game minimum for adult bowlers) If no past or current average, bowlers (adult and youth ) must enter with an average of 220.
7. If only average available in Rule 7 is a “Sport League” average, bowlers average will be adjusted based on the “sport bowling average adjustment chart.
8. Average corrections can be made up to the end of the bowler's first game of a series. Or, if an extension of time has been granted in writing by tournament management before the end of the bowler's first game of a series, the correction can be made within 48 hours after the end of the series.
9. USBC Rule 319a-2 (10 pin rule) is waived. USBC Rule 319d (reporting prize winnings and USBC Rule 319e (Average adjustment for entry) are waived.
10. Bowlers are responsible for to verifying his/her own average whether submitted by the bowler, the team captain or others. If the submitted average is lower than required and results in a lower classification or higher handicap, the bowler's score is disqualified (USBC Rule 319a-3).
11. *Youth bowlers will receive POINTS based on the results of this event. These POINTS and others awarded during Bay Area USBC Youth events may be accumulated as long as the bowler remains a certified youth bowler. Youth bowlers may apply for scholarship funds based on accumulated points on HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION. Youth bowlers will be required to verify academic eligibility prior to scholarship funds being awarded. Youth bowlers MUST SUBMIT a copy of their high school transcript and a copy of their letter of acceptance to a college, university or technical school when applying for the funds. In order to receive ANY FUNDS, youth bowlers must have a grade point average of at least 2.5 (on a 4 point scale) for their cumulative high school academic career to be eligible to receive any scholarship awards. NOTE: Bowlers who do not meet this GPA requirement will be required to submit other documentation to support their eligibility (school and community activity records, any academic awards won and an essay on what obtaining these scholarship funds would mean regarding their college plans.)*
